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Classroom News



3RD GRADE

3rd graders, and their fellow 4th graders, have been busy prepping for the upcoming state tests. In addition, they are learning multiplication tables using repeated addition, skip counting and arrays. Thy are determining the central idea of a non-fiction text and using text features to answer questions. Classes are also working on answering short response questions by restating the question, answering what the question is asking us to do, and finding 2 details to support their answers. For women's history month, one of our 3rd grade classes wrote an opinion piece which was reviewed by their peers. Students gave feedback through "glows" (great work) and "grows" (suggestions on what they could work on)!

<u>IST GRADE</u>

First graders completed their opinion writing unit on their favorite Season. They enjoyed working on their writing pieces and learned about seasons in Science! They will soon be moving on to exploring plants and animals! Students are now beginning their personal narrative in which they will be writing about small moments in their life. Students are also working on creating complete sentences with correct punctuation and capitalization so they can write stellar sentences in their personal narratives. In Social Studies, students are exploring different places around the world with varying climates. In math first graders are learning adding and subtracting to 20.







2ND GRADE



In ELA, 2nd Grade is working on stories about culture to tie into their Social Studies unit about culture. In math, students just finished their unit about subtraction and are now moving into addition and subtraction word problems and regrouping. In Social Studies, students just

just finished the Culture unit and are now learning about Geography. In Science, 2nd graders are learning about different biomes and ecosystems and the plants and animals that live in each.



4TH GRADE

4th graders are working on various writing assignments, including a group project on Women in History, an opinion piece on Encanto and constructing poems. They are very excited to share their writing! In math, the students are beginning to work on multi-step word problems involving all four operations. In Science, they have been observing succulent plants and the effect that different liquids have on their growth.



Students are also learning about different climate zones. In Social Studies, they are studying immigration through Ellis Island.
